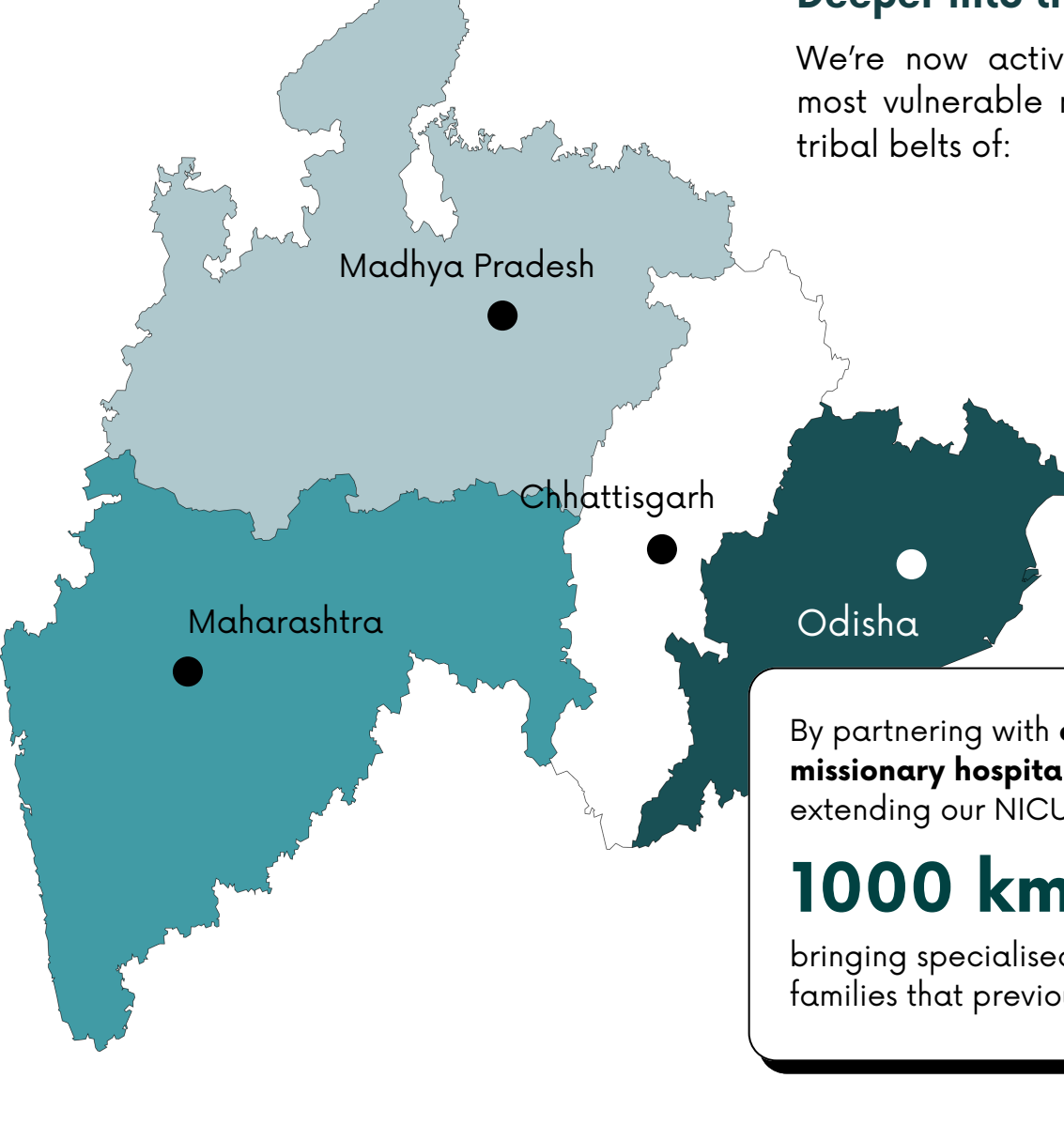

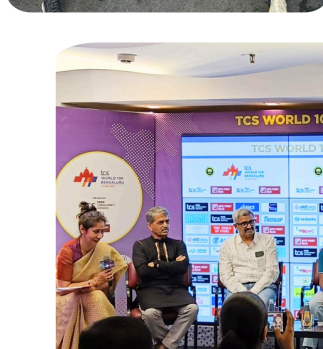

How this 10-year-old preemie became the voice for tiny fighters

Bengaluru: At an age when most children are discovering hobbies, one 10-year-old Bengaluru girl has already supported newborns in hospital intensive care units (NICUs). Her motivation is deeply personal: Neena herself was born in the seventh month of pregnancy in 2015 and spent the first 45 days of her life in a NICU.
Now a class 5 student at Kumbhakonnes International School, Mathanahalli Cross, Neena remembers her early struggles through stories shared by her parents. "She was very tiny with complications, and every single day was uncertain. We were fortunate to affect the treatment, but it made us painfully aware of what other families go through," said her mother Priyanka Bhatnagar, director of the Neonates Foundation of India.

"That awareness turned into action. In 2018, she joined the foundation's core team, helping connect underprivileged families with NICU care through hospitals and doctors. Neena is determined to spread awareness and stand up for newborns who can't yet speak for themselves."
At a fund-raiser for the 7th edition of Tata Consistency Services World 10K Bengaluru held Tuesday, Neena, at her first offline campaign, stood on stage talking about the bitter experience her mother went through. With more than 30,000 runners signed up for the sporting race, the event has already raised over Rs 4 crore for various causes. When asked what inspired her, she said, "After my parents told me what they went through during my birth, I didn't want other babies to suffer because their families can't afford treatment. I want to save them, which led me to this path."
Despite her age, Neena juggles schoolwork and social life with her role as a volunteer. She attended a right virtual meeting every week. It's manageable now because of the summer holidays, but I do get nervous before going on stage. Sometimes, it's hard to focus."
